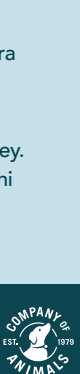

How many treats to feed?

Training Treats

With just 2 calories each, these treats are perfect for frequent use during training. Remember to adjust your dog's daily food intake accordingly.

Calming Treats

Offer 1 treat per 5kg of your dog's body weight.

Dog size	Dog weight	No. of treats
Small	5-10kg	1-2 treats
Medium	10-20kg	2-4 treats
Large	20-30kg	4-6 treats
X-Large	30-40kg	6-8 treats

Early Walks & Socialisation

Training Line 5m – encourages gentle exploration while keeping your puppy close

Treats & Treat Pouch – ideal for rewarding calm behaviour in new environments

Teaching Recall

Training Line 5m – provides safe freedom while practising recall

Whizzclick – combines a loud whistle to get attention and a clicker for marking good behaviour

Treats or Reward Toys – offer instant praise and motivation when your puppy returns

Teething & Biting

Reward Toys – redirect biting by encouraging play with toys, not hands

Training Line 2.5m – helps manage interactions and redirect unwanted behaviour

Toilet Training

Toilet Training Bells – lets your puppy signal when they need to go outside

Coachi Training Whistles

A dog whistle provides a clear, consistent sound that travels further than your voice, making it ideal for recall training, long-distance communication, and ensuring consistent cues when multiple handlers are involved.

Getting Started

Training Line



- 1 Training your dog to react to the whistle is a simple task of linking the sound with a reward.
- 2 Firstly, condition your dog to the sound of the whistle by blowing the whistle and then immediately give your dog a treat. They don't have to be sitting or doing anything else.
- 3 To reward your dog use high value rewards (taken from their daily food allowance) or other motivator such as a Reward Toy.
- 4 A whistle can be helpful for consistency especially if your dog is walked by different people and for the sound to be heard by your dog over a longer distance.

Teaching recall & distance sit

Before you start, decide on your whistle signal; typically 3 × short whistles for recall, 1 × long whistle for sit

Recall

- 1 Attach Training Line (only to flat collar or harness).
- 2 Allow dog to wander (only a short distance).
- 3 Call his name enthusiastically and give your chosen whistle command and open your arms wide.
- 4 Back away from dog, encouraging him towards you.
- 5 If he is reluctant, use the Training Line to "reel" him in.
- 6 Once he has reached you, praise and reward.
- 7 Repeat until consistent.
- 8 When responding well, stop using your verbal command and just use the whistle and open arm signal.
- 9 Repeat, gradually increasing the distance.
- 10 Once consistent, you can remove the Training Line.

Distance Sit

- 1 Hold a treat just above your dog's nose, and slowly move it back over his head. His bottom should go to the floor (if he jumps up you have the treat too high).
- 2 As he sits, give your whistle command.
- 3 Praise and reward in the sit position.
- 4 Give a release command, such as Finish and encourage him forward.
- 5 Repeat, gradually phasing out using the treat.
- 6 When consistent, increase the distance between you and your dog before asking for the sit. It is important to return to your dog to reward him, so he understands the reward is for sitting and not for returning to you.

Multi-Clicker

Using a clicker makes reward-based training simple and effective, providing a clear, consistent marker to help dogs quickly learn behaviours like “sit” or “down.” It’s easy to use and helps reinforce positive actions, making training fun and rewarding for both

Getting Started



- 1 You will need some reward treats for your dog during training sessions.
Treats should be small but really tasty and taken from your dog’s daily food allowance.
- 2 Choose a quiet place with no distractions for training sessions.
- 3 For your dog to associate the click sound with a reward, you must first charge the clicker.
- 4 To do this, click and then immediately give your dog a treat.
- 5 Do not click and reward at the same time; the treat must follow the click.
- 6 Repeat this until your dog becomes alert to the sound and starts to expect a treat from you.
- 7 In the early stages even if you click by accident, you must reward your dog.



Multi-Clicker: Teaching recall & distance sit

Sit

- 1 Hold a treat just above your dog’s nose, and slowly move it back over his head. His bottom should go to the floor (if he jumps up you have the treat too high).
- 2 As he sits, click and treat.
- 3 Repeat and when consistent add your command Sit, gradually removing the use of your hand signal.

Down

- 1 Start with your dog in a sit.
- 2 Holding a treat, move it down from his nose to between his front paws. He should slide into a down position.
- 3 Click and treat if he does. It may take a few attempts!
- 4 Repeat and when consistent add your command Down, gradually removing the use of your hand signal.

Coachi Training Lines

A reliable recall is one of the most important skills for keeping your dog safe and giving them freedom to explore. Using a training line allows you to practise recall safely and consistently, helping to build trust and responsiveness without the risk of your dog running off.

Only ever attach a training line to a flat collar or harness

5m lines: Perfect for small puppies & dogs

10m lines: Ideal for larger dogs and recall practice

Waterproof lines: Easy to wash and clean, perfect for muddy walks and beach visits!

Training Line: Teaching recall













- 1 Attach Training Line (only to flat collar or harness).
- 2 Allow dog to wander (only a short distance).
- 3 Call his name 'enthusiastically' and give his recall command i.e. "Come".
- 4 Back away from dog, encouraging him towards you.
- 5 If he is reluctant, use the Training Line to 'reel' him in.
- 6 Once he has reached you, praise and reward with treats or Reward Toy.
- 7 Repeat until consistent, gradually increasing the distance between you and your dog.
- 7 Once responding well, try dropping the Training Line and repeat as above, if he does not return pick up
- 8 Training Line and repeat again until consistent.
- 9 When consistent with the Training Line on the floor, you can try removing the Training Line.
